Our Club's Goals and Action Plans



GOAL 1: Strive to increase our net Club membership by a minimum of 2 members during the 2007-2008 fiscal year

Action Plans:

- Review and utilize the guidance on membership recruitment and retention contained in the *Membership Development Resource Guide*
- Have the Membership Committee review the Club membership list and compare it with former classification lists available from the District Office or other Club web-sites; compare to the Hanover, PA business community for targeted classifications
- Stress the importance of each member inviting guests to Club meetings who may be qualified potential new Club members



GOAL 2: Develop a new community based hands-on service project that will be unveiled for the April 28, 2008 District “Rotary at Work Day”

Action Plans:

- **Our Club has traditionally given significant financial resources back to our community, as well as to national and international charitable causes; however we have not been very active in “hands on” service type projects within our community. Since Rotary is a service club, we should strive to provide that ‘hands on” involvement.**
- **Solicit ideas for the “Rotary at Work Day” from our membership and other key leaders in the community; emphasis could be to benefit the youth of our community**
- **Solicit Club members for someone to Chair this new project**
- **Involve the Delone Interact Club members in this project**



GOAL 3: Achieve a minimum of \$100 per member for The Rotary Foundation in accordance with the Rotary International's goals

Action Plans:

- Continue to educate the Club membership on The Rotary Foundation and its many programs
- Stress the importance of the EREY program to new members and promote sustaining membership to all Club members
- Seek new Benefactor and/or Bequest society members through educational programs for our members



Goal 4: Develop and hold at least one Family Rotary event during the Club year

Action Plans:

- Promote fun and fellowship among the Rotary Club members and their families, allowing us to get to know one another on a more personal level
- Consider a family outing to a York Revolution baseball team game; a family outing to a Hershey Bears Hockey game or another type of fun event for the family
- Consider planning a joint family event with the Gettysburg, Littlestown, and/or New Oxford Clubs



GOAL 5: Focus on developing future leaders for the Hanover Rotary Club

Action Plans:

- Promote the importance of having strong committees with a strong committee chair and co-chair
- Promote attendance at the various District seminars through one-on-one contact with members
- Promote attendance at the Rotary Leadership institute, especially for new members; Board approval for payment of registration fees and/or tuition costs for this program and other District programs



GOAL 6: Evaluate the Club's two main fundraising events for viability and sustainability – Art Auction & Sports Night

Action Plans:

- Consider if either event should be revamped, terminated and/or another fundraising event developed to replace or augment the Club's fundraising activities
- Look for ways to increase our profits from our fundraising efforts

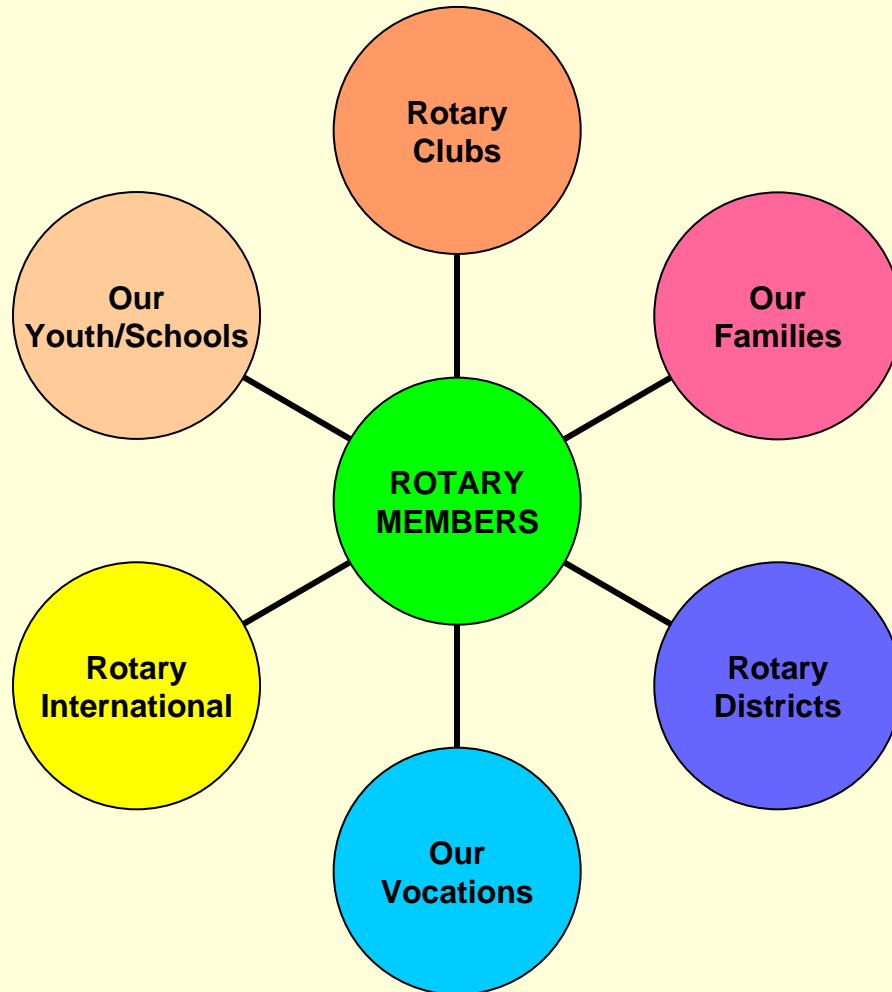
